## PERSONAL LEARNING NETWORK

Here's a great career exploration tool: **develop a Personal Learning Network.** A PLN is an informal network of people that you learn from. In some cases, you'll have direct connections; in others you won't. PLNs can be formed in-person or virtually, so if you don't have career role models in your environment, the internet can be an excellent resource for this tool.

- 1. Simply find the person or people who are excelling in your career field of interest.
- 2. Put your Google skills to work. Research their names to learn more about them. Find articles, videos, reports, publications, etc. Collectively, these resources will help you learn more about:
  - a. Their work experiences (what they liked, didn't like, wished they'd handled differently, etc.)
  - b. Their career journey (where they began, past jobs, where they worked, what paths led to their current position)
  - c. Helpful lessons learned along the way
- 3. Bookmark or print your findings. Organize, file and keep for your personal reference and inspiration.

This process will help you build a personal "library", filled with information that is **meaningful to you**. Give it a try! Use this worksheet for each person in your PLN.
